Phase 1 - Entries Accepted

1. Entries for the show can be submitted anytime between 5/23/2022 to 6/6/2022.
 - a. Complete an entry - online (preferred) or via the mail.
 - i. Online entries will set up an account and add horses and riders and associated classes.
 - ii. Mailed entries will also need to set up an online account to copy and paste video link(s) and view online scores.
 - b. A confirmation email will be provided to the rider and owner's email listed on the entry.
 - c. This email will contain a link to your PREFILLED CLASS INFORMATION SIGN for use at the beginning of your videoed ride.
 - d. The PREFILLED CLASS INFORMATION SIGN can also be found on the online account used to create the entry.
 - e. **Note: No class changes after 6/6/2022 (NO EXCEPTIONS!)**

Phase 2 - Videos Submission Accepted

1. Videos can be submitted from the time the entry is made and you have received your prefilled sign (5/23/2022 – 6/6/2022) through 6/17/2022.
 - a. Follow the guidelines on page four (4) to video your ride.
 - b. Upload your video(s) to your personal YouTube account, see directions below.
 - i. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=I0eM1_JVqHE&list=PL9hW1uS6HUfsHJGacB_WVx9yp8jQYHTO-Q&index=2
 - c. Submit your videos by "copying and pasting" your video link(s) into the classes you entered on your online account.

Phase 3 - Judging and Score Board

1. The judges will judge the tests from 6/20/2022 through 7/6/2022.
2. Initial scores will be posted to your online account as they are judged.
3. All official exhibitor scores will be posted to www.showsecretary.com/ on 7/09/2022.
4. An Online Award Ceremony will be held 07/10/2022.



Online Show Guidelines

Please take all guidelines into consideration when preparing your video test submission.

- 1. Use arenas that are as close to regulation size as possible** and be sure letters are set appropriately to be **easily viewed** by the judge. Cones with large letters on them and poles on the ground to delineate the corners are acceptable and encouraged. For arena measurements, please visit this link,
<https://westerndressageassociation.org/western-dressage-arena/>
 - a. Intro and Basic must use a 20 x 40-meter arena
 - b. Level 1 through Level 5 must use a 20 x 60-meter arena
 - c. All Freestyles are in a 20 x 60-meter arena
- 2. Videos of tests must be unedited from start to finish**, including the equipment, attire, and bit check. They must be always one continuous recording with the horse and rider visible.
- Videos must be filmed in **LANDSCAPE** orientation.
- 4. The test must be videoed from behind C**, 3 to 6 feet from the rail, where the judge would normally be seated. Try adding a little height by standing on a mounting block, for example.
- Prior to beginning the test, the **PREFILLED CLASS INFORMATION SIGN (including the DATE filmed) must be videoed for at least 5 seconds**. Remove the sign just before the ride begins. The videographer can hold the sign then move back to behind the camera or hold the sign in front of the camera at arm's length while also holding the camera. The sign must be in focus, for the correct ride, and held in front of the camera long enough to be readable.
- 6. Keep the horse in frame**, paying close attention to the near corners. You may zoom in on the far end and corners. Videos must be in focus. Keep the camera centered on the horse on the centerlines.
- 7. Make sure to keep the letters in the frame** that are elements of the test being performed. Keep the horse in the LAST one third of the viewing screen in landscape view (2/3 of the viewscreen in front of moving horse). This will allow the "judge" to see approximately two letters in front of the horse which is necessary for depth perception and line evaluation. In general, keep the horse's feet in the bottom 1/3 of the viewfinder.
- Coaching during the test is not allowed EXCEPT for WDAA Exceptional Rider tests
- 9. The natural background sound for the test must be audible**. Tests with no sound at all will not be accepted. Freestyles must have music in the background but not digitally added to the video itself. The test may be called.
- The video may not be a ride from a previous show.

EQUIPMENT CHECK REQUIREMENTS

1. As soon as the test is finished, the camera must **slowly circle the horse and rider showing all equipment and attire from both sides**, including spurs and whip if used. The spurs must be shown for a count of three seconds. You do not need to spin the rowels.

If the videographer is unable to enter the arena, at G the rider may turn the horse slowly, wait five seconds, then turn slowly to show the second side, and wait an additional 5 seconds to complete filming of the equipment.

2. Show the bridle on the horse, from both sides.
3. After a view of both sides of the horse is shown the rider must dismount for the bridle check.
 - a. Exceptional riders are exempt from the bit dropping requirement and are not required to dismount. Participants should still abide by all USEF regulations pertaining to attire, tack and equipment for the recognized show.
4. Prior to dropping the bridle, show that two fingers can fit between the cavesson (if there is one) or bosal and the horse's cheek, then drop the bit.
5. Hold the bridle still so the bit can clearly be seen, in frame, for a minimum count of five seconds.
6. Do the same with your curb chain or bit.
7. If you are using a bosal, you must drop that as well. After you remove the bosal, show both sides of your horse's face, unobstructed, as well as the bosal.
8. The cavesson must be shown to the camera, both inside and out.
9. Prior to submitting your video, review the equipment check in detail to ensure that all of the above requirements have been met and that the equipment checks have a clear, focused, steady view of your tack.
10. You are responsible for knowing the correct rules for tack, attire and equipment for Western Dressage. See USEF WD121-123 for additional information.
- 11. If your equipment check is unable to be completed due to any of the above rules not being followed, your ride will have to be retaped and resubmitted.**

PLEASE NOTE

Show Management will review all submissions to ensure adherence to the guidelines as stated above. If a test is submitted that does not comply with these guidelines, Show Management will contact the exhibitor immediately via email or phone. The exhibitor must submit a replacement video no later than noon MST on 6/19. Those that submit videos near the closing date of Phase 2 and are told they must make a new video will have until noon MST 6/19 to submit a replacement.

Payment: Entries must be completed online at ShowSecretary.com or entry form (below) must be filled out and mailed with payment to the show secretary by the closing date. Entries submitted by mail risk being delayed which will delay entry submission process. Online entries are highly recommended.

When paying by credit card, cards are only accepted during the online entry phase on www.showsecretary.com. Do not write credit card information on a mailed entry and do not email credit card information to the show secretary.

To enter online, go to www.showsecretary.com. Online entries will incur a 3.5% online convenience fee. Online entries must be completed by the closing date and no class changes can be made after closing date

When submitting entries by mail, the entry will not be accepted until the check arrives to the show secretary and must be from a United States bank with United States funds or cashier's check. A completed online or mailed entry form, and (if applicable) copies of amateur card, and payment online or by check must be received by the show secretary **by 6/6/2022** for an entry to be accepted.

Refunds: Entries canceled for any reason **prior to the closing date** will be refunded, minus the office fee and online convenience fee (if applicable). In the event the competition is canceled, Total Entry Fees minus the office fee and online convenience fee (if applicable) will be refunded. The show incurs many costs, particularly after the closing date. Thank you for understanding.

2022 Online International Awards

- Everyone who places in a class or division will receive an item directly from Tioga Territory with their titles printed on it, along with the Online International Exhibitor logo.
- All others will receive a 2022 WDAA Western Dressage Online International Challenge Exhibitor patch.

A. Class Awards

1st – 10th place will be awarded in all classes, your placing will be represented on your item from Tioga Territory as Champion, Reserve Champion or top 10.

B. Division Championship Awards

Division champions (1st place in one of the following divisions) will receive an Online International buckle

1st through 10th place will be awarded in all classes, your placing will be represented on your item from Tioga Territory as Champion, Reserve Champion or top 10.

Division Calculations

Awarded to the highest average percentage of the top two scores at the level. One score MUST be from either test 3 or test 4 and the other score can be from any other test within the level.

Award Notes

- In the event of a tie, the combination with the highest single percentage will earn the tie breaker.
- Musical freestyles DO NOT count toward Division championship awards.

C. Overall High Score Awards The winner will receive a saddle pad from Circle Y Saddlery

(Based on the top score from one test across all levels except freestyle)

- Junior Rider = 13 and under
- Junior Rider = 14- 17
- Amateur Rider = 18 -39 years of age
- Amateur Rider = 40 – 59
- Amateur Rider = 60 and up
- Open Rider = 18 -39 years of age and
- Open Rider = 40 years of age and up
- Exceptional Rider

Note: Rider DOB must be submitted with entry to be eligible for Overall High Score Awards

D. Special Awards

Special awards can be printed on an item from Tioga Territory if you receive one for placing in a class. If not, you may purchase an item from Tioga Territory and WDAA will cover the cost of printing your special award on that item.

WDAA Versatility Horse - Any horse and rider team that shows in all 3 divisions (Horsemanship, WDAA test and Freestyle). To compete for this Special Award, you must add this designation to your entry (on entry blank or chosen as a class in the online entry process).

Breed High Score Awards –The high score winner from each declared breed.

International Challenge – Highest scoring exhibitor from each non-US country competing. (Note: Video must be ridden and produced in the non-US country listed on the entry blank).

Military Veteran – Highest scoring horse and rider team where the rider is a Military veteran (Non-US Military is also included).

Century Rides – The Dressage Foundation recognizes riders and horses whose combined ages total 100 years or more. For more information and registration please visit <https://www.dressagefoundation.org/>. We welcome anyone wishing to complete their Century Ride in the 2022 WDAA Western Dressage Online International Challenge. To compete for this Special Award, you must add this designation to your entry (on entry blank or chosen as a class in the online entry process).

E. 2nd Annual WDAA Harmony Award

All exhibitors that meet the following requirements, will be part of a drawing for a trophy saddle designed and created by master saddle maker Mike Corcoran.

1. A horse and rider team must have shown and been judged in the 2022 WDAA Online International Show and the 2022 WDAA World Championship Show
2. That team must have earned an 8.0 or higher, in harmony at both shows
3. Every test in which the horse and rider team achieve an 8.0 or higher in harmony will count as an additional entry in the drawing

The drawing for the saddle will be held Saturday during the World Show Awards Celebration. Scores are automatically tracked by the show secretary, so you can focus on your ride!

Competition Rules

WDAA Memberships: All owners, and riders **MUST be a member of WDAA** to compete in this show. You may join WDAA at www.westerndressageassociation.org.

Amateur Status: If you are entering amateur classes, you must submit a WDAA DECLARATION OF AMATEUR STATUS form (found below and on the WDAA site). Please read the form and provide needed documents accordingly. If you select option 1 (you possess an "ACTIVE" amateur card from USEF, AQHA, APHA or any other equestrian association), you must also submit a copy of the card. The DECLARATION OF AMATEUR STATUS can be found below on page 16:

The DECLARATION (and card if applicable) must be emailed to the show secretary or uploaded to <https://www.showsecretary.com/Razor/Calendar/Upload/967>; or mailed to the show secretary.

If you are found to NOT be an amateur, you will forfeit your entries with no refund.

Junior Status: Riders are eligible to compete as juniors if they are 17 years of age or less at the beginning of the 2022 competition year (December 1, 2021 – November 30, 2022). [GR 103](#).

Prefilled Class Information Sign: You will be provided with a sign to use at the beginning of the video. A link to this document will be emailed to you and will be available to print out online. The beginning of the video must contain at least 5 seconds of this document. Video will not be judged without this prefilled sign – DO NOT create your own sign.

All decisions of equipment checkers, show secretary, judges and WDAA Board of Directors are final. There is no protest covenant at this non USEF licensed event.

- Physically Challenged classes (use standard WDAA tests) Open to individuals with a diagnosed significant physical disability. A **WDAA Statement of Eligibility for Exceptional Rider Classes** form is required to show in these classes. (Located below the Entry Blank).
- Therapeutic Rider classes (use WDAA Therapeutic Rider tests) Open to individuals with a diagnosed physical, social, or emotional disability. A **WDAA Statement of Eligibility for Exceptional Rider Classes** form is required to show in these classes. (Located below the Entry Blank).

Exceptional riders are exempt from the bit dropping requirement and are not required to dismount. Participants should still abide by all USEF regulations pertaining to attire, tack, and equipment for the recognized show. Reference [GR120](#) for additional information.

Class Restrictions

- Horses may be ridden by two riders. Each horse/rider combination requires a separate entry with all signatures and emergency contact. [WD 102](#)
- No horse may be ridden in the same class number more than once (even with a different rider) per [WD 102.2](#)
- Horse/rider combinations showing in walk/jog rail classes are not eligible for other rail classes or any test other than Introductory Level (Different horse/rider combinations are eligible for other rail classes and tests)
- Horses may only compete in levels that are adjacent with the same rider. For example, a horse may not be ridden in a basic level test and a level two test UNLESS with a different rider. [WD 102](#).
- A horse may be ridden by a maximum of two riders. [WD 102](#).
- To be eligible for Intro Level, a horse/rider combination must not have shown in a Western Dressage test at First level or above in the same competition year. [WD 130.1](#).

Entries and Scoring

A. General Information:

Entries must be entered online by the closing date. If paying by check, make checks payable to WDAA. To pay with a credit card, you must use online entry. Please visit www.showsecretary.com for online entry. Every horse/rider team requires a separate entry and will pay a separate office fee.

Do not email the entry form below. The entry form below must be mailed with payment and proof of amateur status (if applicable).

For an entry to be considered complete, you must include the WDAA membership numbers for Owner and Rider. If WDAA membership numbers are not received by 6/5, the entry will not be accepted. No exceptions.

Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries, combine or cancel classes, and modify the schedule to make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed enough by Show Management.

B. Tests and Exhibitor Gift

- A link to the score sheet will be provided to the rider and owner shortly after the test is scored.
- All exhibitors will receive a 2022 WDAA Western Dressage Online International Challenge patch from WDAA.
- Following the Awards ceremony, Tioga Territory the Official Merchandise supplier of WDAA will begin shipping all placing exhibitors an item with the 2022 Online International Exhibitor Logo and their titles printed on it. Please be patient for your items to be shipped this will be a very big project.

For and in consideration of Western Dressage Association of America ("WDAA") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, handler, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, judge, official, contractor, staff, trainer or volunteer) in a WDAA sanctioned, licensed or recognized event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities. I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree to be bound and abide by the rules, regulations, and policies of WDAA as published in the USEF Western Dressage Rules and on the website at <https://westerndressageassociation.org/>, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any WDAA Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases such as COVID-19 or other illness caused by the virus SARS-CoV-2), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the WDAA Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the WDAA Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any WDAA Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any WDAA Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any WDAA Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify (meaning reimburse or pay), defend and hold harmless the following parties: WDAA, WDAA recognized affiliates, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges, officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any WDAA Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the WDAA Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a WDAA Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and

reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature, including without limitation personal injury, wrongful death, property damage (including to any horse), loss of consortium, breach of contract, and premises liability ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the WDAA Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding the subject matter of this agreement and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.

F. LAW AND JURISDICTION: Colorado law governs this Agreement. All claims or proceedings arising out of or related to this Agreement must exclusively be filed or entered into in Douglas County, Colorado, or the U.S. District Court in Colorado.

G. This Agreement applies to any and all injury, damage, death or loss which may occur in present or future participation.

I HAVE CAREFULLY READ THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY, UNDERSTAND ALL OF ITS TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND KNOW IT CONTAINS AN ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND WAIVER FROM LIABILITY, AS WELL AS HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS. BEFORE SIGNING, I HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO ASK QUESTIONS OF A WDAA REPRESENTATIVE ABOUT THIS AGREEMENT.

By signing below, I (as the participant or as the Parent/Legal Guardian of the minor identified below) hereby accept and agree to the terms and conditions of this Agreement in connection with my (or the minor's) participation in any WDAA Event. If, despite this Agreement, I, or anyone on my behalf or the minor's behalf, makes a claim for Liability against any of the Released Parties, I will indemnify, defend and hold harmless each of the Released Parties from any such Liabilities as the result of such claim.

The parties agree that this agreement may be electronically signed. The parties agree that the electronic signatures appearing on this agreement are the same as handwritten signatures for the purposes of validity, enforceability, and admissibility.
